

# Special Notes on Data Protection for Conventions of the German Ornithologists Society (DOG)

When you register as a participant or submit a contribution (presentation, poster) for the DOG annual meeting or other DOG events, we collect personal data from you in order to plan and carry out the conference and to provide you with the services you have booked. To achieve these goals, personal data is collected, stored and processed by us only to the extent appropriate and necessary. The data collected on our website complies with the current requirements of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (EU-GDPR);

From all conference participants, we collect first name, last name, address, email address and – if voluntarily provided – title, institution and telephone number. For participating DOG members, membership status may also be recorded. The status of students, pupils and trainees may be verified based on submitted documentation in order to grant reduced conference fees.

In addition to personal data, we record data on the events and additional bookings selected by participants and store this information either in paper form or digitally.

**Presenters and authors of contributions (talks and posters):** Registration of your contribution takes place online via the DOG website (<https://www.do-g.de/>). The general data protection regulation of the DOG website (<https://www.do-g.de/datenschutz>) therefore also apply. As part of this process, the following mandatory information is typically collected and stored: title of the talk or poster, submitting author or first author (first and last name), place of residence or work, country, email address, co-authors with place of residence or work (if applicable), subject area of the contribution, participation in 'mini talks' (if applicable), name of the DOG member among the authors, abstract of the contribution, preferred address details for the conference proceedings, participation in the early-career competition or other activities (if applicable). Additional voluntary information may be provided regarding subject area, desired feedback and other details.

All digitally collected and stored data of conference participants, presenters and authors are stored on computers and hard drives of the DOG office and its staff, as well as on an external server (as of January 2026: IONOS SE, Elgendorfer Straße 57, 56410 Montabaur, Germany). The data protection regulation of the server provider responsible for hosting and operating the system also apply (<https://www.ionos.com/help/data-protection/>). Access to this data is granted to the DOG office, conference office staff, the DOG board, and, if necessary, other staff, volunteers or external contractors involved in organising the conference.

Specific data of participants, presenters and authors may – if necessary for planning or conducting the conference – be exchanged among the above-mentioned persons via email attachments or data carriers in the form of MS Excel spreadsheets, MS Word documents, PDFs or other file formats and temporarily stored on their respective computers. Otherwise, the collected personal data will not be shared with third parties in written, digital or verbal form, with the following exceptions:

A list of conference participants (first name, last name, place of residence and, if applicable, email address) will be printed in the conference proceedings provided to all attendees. A similar list (excluding email addresses) will be published in an upcoming issue of our journal *Vogelwarte* as part of the conference report. Each participant has the right to object to the publication of this data in whole or in part.

The conference proceedings also include abstracts of all talks and posters, containing data collected during online registration or subsequently submitted by the authors via email. In a later issue of *Vogelwarte*, extended abstracts of all contributions will be published as part of the conference report. These extended abstracts include the data from the conference proceedings as well as additional information provided by the authors.

The conference proceedings (without the participant list) and the journal *Vogelwarte*, including the data mentioned above, are published as PDF files on the DOG website (<https://www.do-g.de/>) and remain freely accessible online indefinitely. The contents of *Vogelwarte* are also permanently accessible online via the ZOBODAT portal (Zoological-Botanical Database), Oberösterreichisches Landesmuseum GmbH, Austria ([https://www.zobodat.at/publikation\\_series.php?id=20832](https://www.zobodat.at/publikation_series.php?id=20832)). The data protection regulation of ZOBODAT therefore also apply (<https://eap.ooe.gv.at/Datenschutz.aspx?lang=en>).

In addition to the uses described above in the conference proceedings and *Vogelwarte*, the data stored in paper or digital form relating to participants, presenters and authors will be retained until the financial settlement of the conference is complete and thereafter in accordance with statutory tax retention periods. Beyond this, we reserve the right to store the first name, last name, institution, and place of residence of participants, presenters, and authors, as well as the titles and abstracts of contributions, indefinitely for the purposes of scientific, organisational, and conference-related documentation. Any affected person may object to this storage at any time by written or electronic communication.

By registering your participation or contribution (typically a talk or poster presentation) for the DOG annual meeting or another DOG conference, you consent to the processing of your personal data and, where applicable, the data of your submitted contribution as described here. You may withdraw this consent at any time for individual data items or for all data you have provided, by notifying us via email or letter at the address below. You may also request information at any time regarding the type and scope of the personal data we have collected and stored about you and how it is used.

## Rules for Photography, Filming, Audio Recording and Social Media during DOG Conventions

To regulate the creation and publication of photos, videos and audio recordings of participants and conference content, and to protect the copyrights of presenters, authors, the German Ornithologists' Society, and the hosting institutions, the following rules apply during and after the DOG annual meeting and other DOG events:

- Photo, audio and video recordings during presentations that exceed 30 seconds or more than three images per presentation require prior written approval from the DOG president or secretary general. They will obtain consent from the affected presenters and local organisers. Requests must therefore be submitted at least 14 days before the event to the DOG secretary general.
- The creation of any photos, audio or video sequences of presentation slides or posters is generally permitted for personal use and to supplement personal notes only. Such material may not be shared, published online or distributed in any medium without the explicit permission of the presenters or authors, nor may it be used in whole or in part in your own presentations or publications. Users must obtain permission from the presenters or authors themselves, preferably in written form.
- Photo, audio and video recordings intended for media coverage of the conference require verbal approval from the DOG president or secretary general. This approval is generally considered granted if media representatives have been invited by the DOG or if participants have been commissioned by the DOG to produce such coverage.
- Photos and videos clearly intended primarily as private memories of the conference (locations, groups, or individuals who consent) are not affected by these rules. The DOG kindly requests free copies of images or video sequences suitable for long-term documentation of the conference.
- Recording or capturing any online-transmitted conference events or components, such as presentations or the general assembly, is not permitted.

- We welcome social media coverage of our annual meeting but explicitly remind participants that copyright and personal rights must always be respected. In principle, participants may comment on the content of individual presentations or posters on social media, provided the above rules are not violated. However, authors have the right to prohibit tweets or other online postings about their contributions, either verbally or in writing, during their presentation or poster session.
- During the conference, photos and videos will be taken on behalf of the DOG or co-organising institutions. These may be used for reporting and public relations purposes, including publication in the press, online media, on our website and on our social media channels (e.g., Bluesky, Instagram). By participating in the conference, you agree that photos and videos in which you appear may be used for these purposes. If you do not wish photos or videos of you to be published, please inform the responsible persons on site or contact the DOG office (email: [geschaeftsstelle@do-g.de](mailto:geschaeftsstelle@do-g.de) , phone: +49 (0)176 78114479). We respect your privacy and will ensure that all recordings are used responsibly and in compliance with data protection regulations.
- Any additional restrictions arising from the house rules of the hosting institutions or co-organisers remain unaffected.
- The provisions of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (EU-GDPR) also apply.
